

CSC Bus Trip to FSA...

Snowmass and Aspen, CO: FSA January, 2013

There are just a few spots left on the bus for the annual FSA trip being held at Snowmass this year. Don't miss out on an opportunity to ski/board 3,132 acres of terrain, 91 trails, 4,406 vertical feet, and ride all 21 chairlifts! This mountain offers cruisers, trees, steeps, terrain parks and half-pipes to keep one busy the entire trip but your lift ticket is also good at Aspen Mt., Buttermilk (home of the X games while we are there) and Aspen Highlands. A free shuttle will take you to any of the mountains.



This trip is a bargain and includes sleeper bus transportation, four days of skiing, four nights of minimum occupancy lodging in a ski-in, shuttle-out condos at Woodbridge, FSA activity ticket and club pizza party. The optional 5th day lift ticket will be available for \$47.00. The sleeper bus will leave Lincoln Tuesday evening, January 22, and return early Monday morning, January 28, 2013.

March 2013 Trip to North Lake Tahoe

The Omaha Ski Club and CSC are joining together to offer this fun adventure to North Lake Tahoe. Enjoy beautiful views of the lake from the Cal Neva Resort. WOW!! Five different mountains in six days (optional 6th day is also a possible ski day!) This adventure has several CSCers already signed up for the the trip. The flight leaves on March 2 from Omaha at 9:00 a.m. and returns to Omaha on March 9 at 7:45 p.m. Trip includes airfare on Southwest (no bag charges!!!), transfers, hotel lodging at Cal Neva Resort, five days of lift tickets and parties. Trip insurance is optional. Every day will be a new adventure at a different mountain including Squaw Valley, Alpine Meadows, Homewood, Sugar Bowl and Mt. Rose. An optional day is available at Diamond Peak.

A little information on each mountain:

Squaw Valley: This past summer, Squaw Valley replaced the old High Camp Chairlift with the Big Blue Express, a high-speed 6-pack. The Links double chair has been replaced with the Mountain Meadow triple chairlift, which goes to the ridgeline near the top of the Solitude and Silverado lifts. You can lounge by the giant Olympic rings from the 1960 Winter Games and have a sweeping view of Lake Tahoe. This mountain is most known for its steeps but also has beginner and intermediate terrain located at the top of the mountain easily accessed by the tram and gondola. A must ski?? KT-22 for the adventuresome strong skier.

<u>Alpine Meadows:</u> This mountain has an open-boundary policy and if you can see it, you can ski it. Alpine Bowl is perfect for carving intermediate turns and experts can head to Wolverine. The motto at Alpine Meadows is "follow the sun." Multiple east and west facing aspects make it possible to ski sun-ripened slopes all day.

<u>Homewood:</u> Homewood Resort has the folksy charm of a 1960s ski hill with vertigo-inducing views of Lake Tahoe. One can cruise groomers nearly two miles from the top to the lake shore for a thigh-burner. There is also good tree-skiing available. Take a breather at the top of Glory Hole and admire the glorious lake view.

<u>Sugar Bowl:</u> Sugar Bowl is a modest sized mountain that was founded in 1939 by Walt Disney and cohorts, making it the first true destination resort in the Sierra—the Sun Valley of California. Strawberry Fields has the deepest and least tracked snow on a powder day—and often days after.

Mt. Rose: This ski area is the highest elevation resort in the Lake Tahoe area with a base elevation of 7,400 feet and faces predominantly north and east resulting in great ski conditions. It's a friendly and easy going area. Mt. Rose has built a new glass-front day lodge for those that need a rest from the skiers that log loads of mileage on the intermediate and advance terrain in a few short hours!
