

#### Steamboat Race Results

The Cornhuskers started the racing Thursday afternoon in the snowshoe relay. The A team of Mike Williams, Laura Williams, Dan Griffith and Derek McElvain had a good race and finished third with a time of 1:25.4, which was three tenths of a second out of second place. The Cornhusker B team of Carl Roemer, Kristen Simpson, Henry Rohla and Jon Springer had a time of 1:54.4.

Friday was the challenge Alpine racing in the morning starting with the 50 and above men. Wayne Simpson in the 80-84 won the FSA Gold; in the 60-64 Mike Williams won a Silver; in the 55-59 Tom Starr won a Silver; in the 45-49 Greg Glunz won a Silver; in the 40-44 Jeremy Wilson won a bronze; and in the 35-39 Derek McElvain won a Silver.



The Women's races were in the afternoon. Kathy Spahr in the 65-69 won a Bronze; in the 40-44 Jennifer Simpson won the Gold; in 35-39 Lori Simpson won the Gold and Kristen Simpson won the Silver.

Saturday morning were the snowboard races. For the Women in the Group B Kristen Simpson won the Gold. For the men in Group B, Jon Springer won the Gold; in Group C, Chad Martens won the Silver.

Thursday afternoon was the Open race. Mike Williams and Mark Hutchins earned Nastar Gold, Derek

McElvain and Tom Starr earned Silver, Hollis Anderson earned a Bronze.

For the Nastar medals earned on Friday, Wayne Simpson and Mike Williams earned a Gold, Tom Starr, Jerry Luedtke, Mark Hutchins and Derek McElvain all earned Silver, Jeremy Wilson, Greg Glunz, Jon Morgan, John Sedlak, Rocky Bondegard, Jerry Obrist and Dave Camper all earned Bronze.

For the Women Nastar medals Friday, Lori Simpson, Kathy Spahr and Sajal Glunz earned Silver. Jennifer Simpson, Kristen Simpson and Haley all earned Bronze.

For the Snowboard Nastar medals, Kristen Simpson earned a Silver; Chad Martens, Jon Springer and Mike Williams all earned Bronze. For the overall team scoring, a year ago at Snowmass the Cornhuskers missed out of third place by two points to Oklahoma City. This year was a very good year for the Cornhuskers as we had more racers and medal winners thus resulting in a third place finish 2,184 over Oklahoma City with 1,948, that was a 236 point improvement!



#### **COPPER TRIP IN FEBRUARY**

Copper has been working furiously to install their two new lifts. As of this writing, the American Eagle is open and operating with 6-pack chairs and gondolas for a new experience. The Flyer is still being installed and will hopefully be running by our arrival February 24.

This drive-out trip begins Sunday, February 24 with 3 nights lodging. Lodging and lift tickets have been ordered but we may be able to add you to this adventure if you contact Tom Becker now!

Pre-trip party will be Sunday, February 10 from 4 - 6 p.m. Hosting will be Todd & Teresa Ingram at 1000 N. 100<sup>th</sup> St. (north off of O St on 98th St to Waterford Estates, right to No. 100th & left on No. 100th to 1000 No.) in Lincoln.

Trip information will be distributed. Please bring snacks to share. Drinks will be provided.

COST: \$380.00 for 3 nights lodging at Center Village AND 3 day lift ticket AND pizza party!! That's just over \$100 per day for a lift ticket and warm lodging with friends. How can you pass this up? Lift tickets are \$42.00 per day so add for a 4<sup>th</sup> day or subtract for less than 3 days. We can add an additional night's lodging on the back end of the trip for \$60 per person (Wednesday, Feb. 27). There will be two change rooms available Wednesday afternoon.

If you want to use the ski lockers in the building bring a number combination padlock. Lockers are on first floor and locks are not provided.

**COST** for lodging and pizza party with NO lift ticket: \$254.00.

#### CORNHUSKER SKI CLUB TRIP POLICIES

- Membership is mandatory to participate in trips organized by the Cornhusker Ski Club. A completed and signed Cornhusker Ski Club membership form must be submitted with membership dues payable to Cornhusker Ski Club.
- 2. To reserve a place on the trip, a deposit must be given to the Trip Captain with checks payable to the Cornhusker Ski Club. \$15 of the deposit is non-refundable in the event that you cancel your participation on the trip for any reason.
- The balance of the trip fee is due according to announced schedules. If the Trip Captain does not have payment by these dates, your name will be dropped and your reservation filled from the waiting list.
- Once a trip is filled, no deposit is required to place your name on a waiting list.
- 5. Trip cancellations or changes will be accepted by the Trip Captain up to 90 days <u>prior</u> to trip departure. Cancellations or changes <u>within</u> 90 days of the trip departure will be refunded only if you find a replacement, or if the Trip Captain can fill your place from the waiting list. Refunds are subject to the \$15 non-refundable deposit. Purchasing individual trip insurance is recommended.
- The Cornhusker Ski Club will not be liable for any canceled or altered services, including price increases, not initiated by the Cornhusker Ski Club.
- Children under 18 who are members with parents, are welcome on trips when accompanied by a responsible adult.
- 8. On all the trips, the bus will not wait for latecomers on either the trip out or the trip back.
- Bunk assignments are on a first-come basis, unless stated otherwise by the Trip Captain.

- 10. No seat swapping is allowed on the bus. The same order of seating en route will be in effect on return unless exception is made by the Trip Captain, with concurrence of all involved.
- 11. Smoking is prohibited on the buses.
- Hallucinogens (drugs) and /or marijuana are prohibited.
   Usage will be grounds for membership dismissal. The same applies to unruly behavior or profanity.
- Lights out on return after 10:00 p.m., if the next day is a weekday.
- 14. Trips may be supplemented with drive-outs only on the condition of the bus being filled and that a hardship would not otherwise be imposed on others.
- 15. Trip Captains will have the final say on any discretionary matters. If there are any complaints, these should be reduced to writing and sent to the overall Trips Chair.
- 16. Cornhusker Ski Club is not responsible for any personal injury or property damage that may occur during a club organized function. Members assume all legal and financial responsibility for damage to any facilities used by them. If individual responsibility cannot be ascertained, cost of damages will pro-rated among room occupants. Members causing property damage can be dismissed from the club and denied new memberships as stated in the By-Laws.
- 17. The club is not responsible and shall not be liable for loss of personal property and/or delays or inconveniences sustained by any members or participant in any activity or trip arranged in whole or part by the Cornhusker Ski Club.
- 18. At Cornhusker Ski Club meetings and functions, members are prohibited from promoting any trips or activities except those organized by the Cornhusker Ski Club.
