FSA 2023 WAS A *REAL TRIP!*

Thirty-one adults and four children from the Cornhusker Ski Club made their way to Whitefish, Montana, for our annual Flatlander Ski Association (FSA) Ski and Race trip. Our Club stayed at the Edelweiss, a ski in/out resort. A short 5-minute walk to multiple lifts was very convenient instead of having to shuttle to the slopes. Right next door to the Edelweiss was The Bierstube. This was a local bar/restaurant with great cheeseburgers, huckleberry whiskey drinks and some live entertainment. We were also close to other resorts with food and two other restaurants on the mountain.



Most arrived on Friday, January 27, and had time to explore before starting to ski on Saturday. We had the option to ski up to six days. Jon and I took advantage of all six days! If you could make it to the top you got to ski by their world famous Snow Ghost trees (pictured above). You could see them from the base on clear days. Google tells me they are accumulations of super-cooled water droplets called rime. We did have quite a bit of very cold

One of the best spring skiing/boarding destinations in Colorado is Copper Mountain and CSC is going back for the adventure!

Copper Mountain typically has some great "powder dumps" February-March so this should be a great trip for those that seek an occasional powder day.

[No club transportation is offered; it is a self-arranged drive/fly out trip only.] We have lodging reserved for 28.

DATES: Arrive Sunday, February 26, check-in begins at 4 p.m.; depart Friday, March 3.

SKI DATES: Monday, February 27, through Thursday, March 2

BASIC TRIP PRICE: \$580.00, includes lodging only.

<u>ADD-ON LIFT TICKETS</u>: 2-day = \$164; 3-day = \$231; 4-day = \$298; 5-day = \$372.50 (no senior discount). This means that you can ski for about \$75.00 per day which is "awesome, awesome, awesome!!" You could also purchase your own 4-day pass in advance from Copper Mountain.

LODGING: Center Village 2-bedroom condos for **5 nights** starting Sunday, February 26; checkout on Friday, March 3.

<u>DRIVING</u>: One car is allowed per unit in the underground parking. Other vehicles will be parked in Lot A and require a parking pass (free of charge).

TRIP INSURANCE

It's been said that trip insurance is never needed until it's needed.

What should you know about trip insurance?

- You must purchase trip insurance coverage <u>before</u> it is needed. Once you recognize the need, it is too late to protect your trip.
- After the initial trip payment is made and you have a good grasp of your total expected trip cost, it is good time to get the most accurate quote.
- An example of coverage for a \$1,500 trip within the United States for a 60-year-old is approximately \$63 through www.insuremytrip.com.
- If you need coverage for a pre-existing medical condition, there are time-sensitive eligibility requirements tied to your initial trip payment and you may have a limited amount of time to buy a plan.



CORNHUSKER SKI CLUB TRIP POLICIES

- Membership is mandatory to participate in trips organized by the Cornhusker Ski Club. A completed and signed Cornhusker Ski Club membership form must be submitted with membership dues payable to Cornhusker Ski Club.
- To reserve a place on the trip, a deposit must be given to the Trip Captain with checks payable to the Cornhusker Ski Club. \$15 of the deposit is non-refundable in the event that you cancel your participation on the trip for any reason.
- The balance of the trip fee is due according to announced schedules. If the Trip Captain does not have payment by these dates, your name will be dropped and your reservation filled from the waiting list.
- Once a trip is filled, no deposit is required to place your name on a waiting list.
- 5. Trip cancellations or changes will be accepted by the Trip Captain up to 90 days <u>prior</u> to trip departure. Cancellations or changes <u>within</u> 90 days of the trip departure will be refunded only if you find a replacement, or if the Trip Captain can fill your place from the waiting list. Refunds are subject to the \$15 non-refundable deposit. Purchasing individual trip insurance is recommended.
- The Cornhusker Ski Club will not be liable for any canceled or altered services, including price increases, not initiated by the Cornhusker Ski Club.
- Children under 18 who are members with parents, are welcome on trips when accompanied by a responsible adult.
- On all the trips, the bus will not wait for latecomers on either the trip out or the trip back.
- Bunk assignments are on a first-come basis, unless stated otherwise by the Trip Captain.

- No seat swapping is allowed on the bus. The same order of seating en route will be in effect on return unless exception is made by the Trip Captain, with concurrence of all involved.
- 11. Smoking is prohibited on the buses.
- Hallucinogens (drugs) and /or marijuana are prohibited.
 Usage will be grounds for membership dismissal. The same applies to unruly behavior or profanity.
- Lights out on return after 10:00 p.m., if the next day is a weekday.
- 14. Trips may be supplemented with drive-outs only on the condition of the bus being filled and that a hardship would not otherwise be imposed on others.
- 15. Trip Captains will have the final say on any discretionary matters. If there are any complaints, these should be reduced to writing and sent to the overall Trips Chair.
- 16. Cornhusker Ski Club is not responsible for any personal injury or property damage that may occur during a club organized function. Members assume all legal and financial responsibility for damage to any facilities used by them. If individual responsibility cannot be ascertained, cost of damages will pro-rated among room occupants. Members causing property damage can be dismissed from the club and denied new memberships as stated in the By-Laws.
- 17. The club is not responsible and shall not be liable for loss of personal property and/or delays or inconveniences sustained by any members or participant in any activity or trip arranged in whole or part by the Cornhusker Ski Club.
- At Cornhusker Ski Club meetings and functions, members are prohibited from promoting any trips or activities except those organized by the Cornhusker Ski Club.

WAIVER/RELEASE FOR COMMUNICABLE DISEASES INCLUDING COVID-19

The novel coronavirus, COVID-19 has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. COVID-19 is extremely contagious and is believed to spread mainly from person-to-person contact. As a result, federal, state and local governments and federal and state health agencies recommend social distancing and have, in many locations, prohibited the congregation of groups of people.

Releasor on behalf of him/herself and on behalf of Releasor's heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby releases and holds harmless the Cornhusker Ski Club its officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, volunteers and if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event, ("Releasees") with respect to any and all illness, disability, death, or loss or damage to person or property, whether arising from the negligence of releasees or otherwise, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Cornhusker Ski Club COVID-19 Policy – Effective 06/07/2022

To participate in CSC sponsored ski trips, the following are the Club's policies regarding the current COVID-19 pandemic:

Provided Lodging

- Unvaccinated participants will be required to provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test within 72 hours of their expected arrival at the lodging site persons testing positive will be excluded from the trip.
- Unvaccinated participants will also need to make arrangements with other participants (vaccinated or unvaccinated) they share a condo with. The expense for empty beds in a given condo will be the financial responsibility of the unvaccinated participant.
- Your trip captain may be able to help identify other unvaccinated participants for you to coordinate with.

- Vaccinated participants must send a photo or scanned copy of their vaccination card to the membership chair – csc.ne.membership@gmail.com
- CSC will store this information along with other membership information and will advise trip captains which participants have a vaccination card.
- CSC will monitor local health mandates and advise members as information becomes available.
- CSC advises all members to consider trip insurance in the event of a COVID-19 infection or test results in being unable to attend a trip.
