Disconnect the device with your wireless provider.

Turn the phone's power off.

Make sure the phone's batteries are installed in the phone

Remove the storage cards (microSD) and SIM cards from the phone.

Gather any chargers or other accessories that came with the devices.


The Issue

Studies show 23.6 percent of women and 11.5 percent of men reported at least one lifetime episode of intimate-partner violence.* And, one in five employed adults has been impacted by domestic violence.**

Given such sobering statistics, Verizon recognizes domestic violence as a national problem that has grave consequences for our neighbors, coworkers, friends and family members. The company also understands that its wireless resources – and its human resources – are natural tools to help.

The HopeLine Program

Verizon launched its HopeLine phone recycling program nationwide in October 2001 to put its technology to work in communities and give consumers a way to help prevent domestic violence. The success of HopeLine is driven by the support of individuals and businesses who donate their unused wireless phones and accessories from any service provider in any condition by mail, at Verizon Wireless Communications Stores or at special events and phone collection drives held throughout the year.

Donating Wireless Phones and Service

Wireless phones given to HopeLine are refurbished and resold for reuse, generating proceeds for the program. If donated phones are no longer usable, they are recycled in an environmentally sound way.

Verizon also donates wireless phones – complete with wireless service and other features – to local domestic violence organizations or local government and law enforcement agencies for use with their domestic violence clients. The phones can serve as a vital link to emergency or support services in times of crisis or simply as a private, safe connection to employers, family and friends.
